On Saturday, 28th May 2016, the Navua Rotuman Community gathered at the Serua Provincial Council Hall, Naitata, Navua for their 15th Annual Food-show. The fine weather was a blessing from above as the competitors and their families made their way to the venue. Guests and friends from as far as Lautoka, Valelevu and Suva corridor arrived in good numbers to witness first-hand what their brothers in Navua had yielded for the much awaited 2016 competition considering the wrath of category one cyclone Winston in the month of February.

The program commenced at 8.40a.m with Reverend Fereti Leo of the Saint Timothy Methodist Indian Circuit, Navua reminding everyone that each competitor has been *blessed and whether* the yield was satisfactory or not, they were to give thanks, what you sow is what you reap and that the competitors are sowing the harvest for the last 9 – 11 months of nurturing and maintenance for this day – this is the day that the Lord has made. Rotuman Hymn 114 - Jisu Gagaja a Hanisim Ae was sung – mak ke 'pel after which the Minister delivered a prayer dedicating the day's program and handed over to the Master of Ceremony.

The Chairman, Mr. Freddy Wesley in his address thanked Rev F.Leo for delivering a wonderful and inspirational message and then welcomed everyone and thanked them for their support in attending the event for the last decade plus 5 years and that they have also become part of the foodshow with their continuous support – they were no strangers and were to enjoy the day's program. The Chairman also reminded everyone on the **aim** of the foodshow: the involvement of

youths in the planting, maintenance and harvesting phases, participation in the koua preparations, and as ring crew, scorers, catering and kava crew.

The M.C invited veteran competitor, Mr. John Kaitu'u who spoke briefly on a former and active member and competitor in the late Master Fauoro Manueli being a man of all seasons with his charisma, humour, respect for others and passion for education, tradition and religion -1 minute silence (prayer remembering the former member and strength for his family).

Mr. Jioje Vafo'ou delivered the <u>chief guest speech</u> on behalf of **Fiu Niua** of Sydney and then declared the 2016 foodshow opened.

Guests – families and friends inspected the food crops on display as all supporting staff prepared their workstations for the commencement of the competition.

Mr.Joeli Erasito of Losa, Itu'ti'u who is a seasoned farmer in Haga, Juju was the competition judge this year.

Competition commenced at 9.15a.m with the Filipine ta measured for weight (Maha) and then the length (Roa) followed by Tapiko (maha only) –. The 13 x taro, 10 x yam varieties were measured for weight and length followed by the 4 x Temafa (Kumara, Pari – 4 x varieties in faksara, sansani, vudi ma rahrahu, Merene & Painapa).

Fresh kava flowed during the event as Gagaj Tiu from Itu'muta, Rev Leo and Fagmaniue Pene observed from their kava corner – **fel on le'et kat na ra se ta le'et** as the younger Navua kava crew served with enthusiasm whole day.

Assorted home-made baked pastries, coffee and juice were served during morning tea and were enjoyed by everyone present.

Competition break for buffet lunch at 1.05 p.m and everyone were treated to red pork, curry chicken, fried fresh fish, koua puaka/fupag masi/moa, palusami, fekei mara ma a'ana and niufo'ou.

The competition resumed after lunch with the remaining yams and temafa varieties were weighed. The music entertainment this year with the unavailability of our local PRO-AMS band was through sound system of selected Rotuman, Island and Fijian Vude hits which livened the event as the competitors and guests took the floor with some exciting island moves.

The last crop was measured at 3.30p.m followed by farmers group photo session and end of competition cheers to the audience for their support and patience during the event as the score-keepers—Mary Kaitu'u, Akanisi Manueli, Zackly Konrote, Kristiana, Talei & Sina Kotobalavu—tallied up the points for awards and bets payout.
